TRAINING OVERVIEW

This course is designed to provide Fire Door Technicians or anyone with a CSCS skilled joinery card (or equivalent appropriate experience) the necessary training and skills to install a wide range of fire door sets to the required standards.

Delegates first undergo one day of training in the classroom to understand the necessary legislation, reporting, best practice theory, etc. The second day of training is exclusively practical at one of our dedicated training facilities (or on-site at your premises if the requirements are met) where delegates will have to demonstrate the ability to physically fit and install one of a range of fire doors to the required standards.

Once the installations are complete, delegates will then perform checks on the sets using an industry standard checklist. This will then provide delegates with chance to perform any alterations/corrections.

COURSE AIMS

This course provides safe, hands-on practical fire door installation training, which upon successful completion of a classroom and practical assessment, helps to demonstrate competency in the given tasks to the employer. This is further assisted by the awarding of the nationally recognised training standard City & Guilds, whereby successful delegates will be awarded a City & Guilds Accredited Programme Certificate of Completion

DURATION

2-day practical course normally commencing at 10:00 hours, ending at no later than 16:30 hours, with a 30-minute lunch break, depending on your delivery option.

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LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. An understanding of the Health and Safety at Work Act and associated fire control regulations, including good working practice regarding working with fire doors
2. The ability to successfully install an FD30 fire door to the required standards, along with any approved alterations/remediations required at point of installation

1. Planning - this will lay out the current regulatory standards to be met. Mapping out use, type, ratings of fire doors, giving delegates the ability to assess the correct product to be used	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Understand the need for proper planning/selection process regarding fire doors, with respect to where to find current regulations on fire doors.
2. Understanding - site based working methods in accordance with HSE guidance on working with fire doors	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Perform a small dynamic risk assessment based on the tasks about to be carried out
3. Pre installation phase - an in-depth breakdown of a manufacturer's installation guide including British Standard counterparts mentioned in the installation guide and testing data.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Learn how to breakdown and simplify, often confusing and contradicting manufacturer's data
4. Installation - highlighting the importance of following the installation data provided, along with carrying out any alterations including to the structural openings	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify what elements/components are required to perform a physical door install

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5. Practical - perform a physical FD30 door installation along with any alterations required	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Assess delegate's skill set and techniques for door installations, ensuring compliance is met and limiting the chances of damages during the process
6. Inspection - inspect and snag all doors, then perform any remedial works that may be required	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Assess fire door inspection knowledge and ability to complete remedials competently
7. Evidencing works - providing the ability to record all works being carried out and the legal requirements including the golden thread principle using an appropriate methodology/platform	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Hands on experience using different software to evidence compliance
8. Maintaining compliance - understanding of the importance of ongoing inspections alongside the maintenance and the requirement to record the information	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Understanding of the requirement for Planned Preventative Maintenance inspections

WHAT CERTIFICATION WILL YOU ACHIEVE?

On successfully completing this Fire Door Installation Practical course, delegates will receive a City & Guilds Accredited Programme certificate. This will need to be renewed every years or sooner based on guidance and regulation changes.

HOW IS THIS COURSE DELIVERED?

Learning on day 1 is in a classroom environment in the form of trainer explanation, group discussions, videos and practical classroom exercises.

The second day is exclusively practical and so delegates should come with all necessary PPE and tools to enable them to carry out the practical exercises and installations. This takes place in our exceptional, custom-built, dedicated training environments, or can be delivered on-site at your premises subject to meeting the required criteria.

DO YOU NEED TO BRING ANYTHING WITH YOU?

Yes, you will require the below items. Failure to come prepared with the necessary PPE and tools may result in the delegate being refused to take part in the practical elements of the course:


